

LEGAL NOTICE: The Town of Durham is seeking to engage the services of a Consulting Engineering firm to provide construction inspection and administration services for the following transportation project:

**State Project No. L037-0001,
Higganum Road Improvements, Durham, CT**

Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTICIP)

This project is being funded under the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTICIP).

The construction project consists of replacement of the Fowler Brook Culvert, road wedge paving in selected areas to re-establish crown, selected areas of full depth pavement replacement, overlay paving 3.2 miles of road, underdrains, signage, drainage improvements, guide rail, landscaping and related improvements.

The Consulting Engineering firm selected will be required to provide construction inspection and administration services. The projected construction cost is expected to be in the range of \$2,300,000.

Firms responding to this request should be of adequate size and sufficiently staffed to perform the assignment in accordance with LOTICIP inspection, materials testing and project documentation criteria.

The Consulting Engineering firm will be evaluated and selected based on technical competence, the capacity and capability to perform the work within the time allotted, past record of performance, and knowledge of State, and Municipal procedures.

The fee will be negotiated on a cost-plus basis. The contract will not be subject to DBE/SBE/SBPPP goals.

The selected firm must meet all applicable Municipal and State affirmative action and equal employment opportunity practices.

Three (3) copies of a letter of interest, together with general information on the firm, the firm's brochure, experience of the firm, and resumes/qualifications of key personnel shall be addressed to: Laura L. Francis, First Selectman, Town of Durham, 30 Town House Road, P.O. Box 428, Durham, CT 06422. Proposed sub consultants should be clearly identified. The relationship to any "parent" firm or subsidiary firm, with any of the parties concerned, must be clearly defined. Additionally, all interested firms must submit a detailed statement including the organizational structure under which the firm proposes to conduct business. Personnel in responsible charge of the project will be required to possess and maintain a valid Connecticut Professional Engineer's License. Inspectors must possess and maintain certifications with NETTCP and NICET.

All letters of interest must be received at The First Selectman's office at the above address no later than 2:00 p.m. on Monday, October 29, 2018. Responses received or postmarked after this date will not be considered.
